

## Lesson Plan The Egyptians

**Aims:** To enable the children to experiment with materials to produce shapes and form pieces of historic jewellery, sculpture and boxes

**Objective:** To gain an understanding of the Egyptian culture and their treasures  
– symbolic reference and great architectural influence  
(Shape – colour and form will be evidenced in the children's work)

### Links to the NC:

Maths – Science – History – Art & Design – Design & Technology

### Resources:

Paper – Glue – Card – Gems – Paint – Scissors – String – Tape – Sand – Pens  
– Plastiroc Clay – Paper – Pencils – Rulers – Shearing Elastic – Wool - Felt

**1) Tutankhamen's Tomb:** Using card the children will make a box with a lid. This will then be decorated with plastiroc (air dry clay) where mummified relief work will be applied. These will be left to dry until the afternoon.

Pyramid shapes will be cut with card, the children will mark the inside with symbolic references and the outside will be painted and textured with sand. A doorway into the pyramid will be made. These will then be left to dry.

**2) Paint Tomb boxes:** The children can paint their relief work ready for their Jewellery.

**3) Egyptian Jewellery:** The group will make paper beads – these will be painted using Egyptian golds – ultramarines and reds – they will then be formed into wearable jewellery and can be applied to a collage picture. Jewellery can then be stored in the tomb boxes.
